**94 from Morrow In State Colleges**

A total of 94 students from Morrow county were enrolled in colleges and universities of the State System of Higher Education during 1966-67, according to official statistics made available to Colleges For Oregon's Future, a statewide organization dedicated to public understanding of post-high school educational needs.

The Morrow county enrollment is expected to increase again this year, but figures for 1967-68, won't be available until the end of the school year. Many students are also enrolled in community colleges and independent colleges and universities in Oregon.

Totals from Morrow county included 23 students at the University of Oregon; 1 University of Oregon Medical School; 30 Oregon State University; 2 Oregon College of Education; 3 Southern Oregon College; and 35 Eastern Oregon College.  
 Sharply increased enrollments are expected in the state colleges and universities and the community colleges for years to come.

**Clay Myers Files Election Petition**

Secretary of State Clay Myers filed by petition Thursday for the Republican nomination for Secretary of State on the May 28th primary election ballot.  
 Records in the Elections Division indicate that Myers is the first state-wide candidate to get on the ballot by the petition in perhaps 20 years or more.  
 Oregon law provides that a candidate may go on the ballot by getting 1000 signatures of registered voters of his own party in at least seven counties.

Chairman of the Myers petition drive, Albany businessman Robert Mikkelsen, pointed out that the signature campaign had far exceeded the basic legal requirement.
