March Deadline Set for Wheat Program

Friday, March 15, is the last day growers may file applications to take part in the 1968 voluntary wheat program.

David McLeod, office manager, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation county office, points out that signing up is a necessary first step in qualifying for price-support loans and marketing certificates on 1968-crop wheat. No acreage diversion is provided under the 1968 wheat program.

The national average price-support loan rate for 1968-crop wheat is \$1.25 per bushel, available on all the wheat produced on a participating farm (but not on wheat stored under the "excess" provision). The marketing certificates will be valued at the difference between full wheat parity and the \$1.25 per bushel national average loan value; the certificates will be available on 40 percent of the projected production of the farm allotment. (For the 1967 wheat crop, domestic certificates were worth \$1.36 per bushel.)

The 1968 voluntary wheat program provides for: (1) Substitution of wheat for feed grains or feed grains or wheat by growers who participate in both programs; (2) where requested by the grower for the purpose of substituting wheat, the establishment of a barley base and an oats-rye base for a farm with production history of these crops; and (3) secured storage of wheat produced in excess of the farm allotment (not to exceed 150 percent of the allotment) by growers who at sign-up time declare their intentions to do this.

Farm operators are urged not to postpone filing program applications.

Judging Criteria Given To Inform Fair Exhibitors

Following are some helpful hints for those who are planning to enter Open Class Clothing and Miscellaneous Clothing exhibits at the Morrow County Fair, with information relative to "What a Judge Looks For".

There are three main lots in the clothing division — Adult Clothing, Children's Clothing, and Miscellaneous Clothing (such as garments made from feed sacks, remodeled clothing, laundry bags, etc.) Only one article in each lot number can be exhibited.

A judge first of all looks at the neatness of garment construction and if the garment is clean. She will not disqualify an article that has been laundered several times, but will disqualify one that is soiled. It is always best to pin a label to garment stating how many times it has been laundered. Also label material in garment stating if it is cotton, nylon, wool, synthetics, etc.

Hems should be put in loosely—iron on tape is not recommended. The score card for clothing garments is as follows:
General appearance 50
Color & Design 30
Suitable fabric & trim 20
Construction of garment 40
Well pressed & clean 10

Total 100

I'm sure they would be glad to answer any questions you may have and you may also call me about entering clothing in the fair. Begin now to sew on clothing articles for the fair and enter in as many lots as possible. In this way we will improve the clothing division of our fair—and you will be surprised at how gratifying the results can be.

Flower entries will be accepted on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning until 11:30 a.m. Because of the rush on Wednesday, August 21 of horticulture exhibit entries, it is best to enter all houseplants on Tuesday, August 20. Entries will be open for houseplants and all other flowers that will stay fresh on Tuesday afternoon from 3:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. All other flower entries should be made from 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, August 21. Judging begins not later than 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 21.
