

'Pandering' Law To Help Curb Unwanted Mail

Mail patrons offended by pandering advertisements can now take steps to curb such mail, Postmaster James H. Driscoll reported in announcing plans for administering a new law which gives each family the right to decide that an ad is "erotically arousing or sexually provocative."

When an advertisement sent through the mails is offensive on these grounds, a postal patron can now ask the post office to direct the mailer to send no more mail to him and to remove immediately the patron's name from all mailing lists he owns, controls or rents.

To assist patrons, the Post Office Department has published a brief pamphlet—"How You Can Curb Pandering Advertisements"—which is now available at the Heppner post office. In addition to explaining how the law works, the pocket-size leaflet contains a form letter one can use when sending his complaint to the post office.

The pamphlet explains that when a patron receives an advertisement which is, in his opinion, pandering, he must send the ad, its envelope and the form letter, or one which includes its language, to his post office with the words, "Request for prohibitory order" on the face of the envelope.

Postmaster Driscoll said: "This new law should give some protection to American families offended by advertisements they believe to be morally harmful, particularly to their children."

While the patron's complaint will only be directed to the sender, Postmaster Driscoll believes that one or two complaints will provide substantial protection because "the great bulk of this advertising comes from fewer than 20 so-called 'smut dealers' who are frequently swapping mailing lists."

If a mailer does not strike a complaint's name from this mailing list, and the patron receives a second mailing 30 days after the firm has received the prohibitory order, he may bring the matter to the attention of the postmaster issuing the initial order by writing him and enclosing the second pandering ad with its envelope. If the mailer still fails to respect the order, the Postmaster General may ask the Attorney General to apply for a Federal Court order directing compliance. Failure to observe the order may be punishable by a fine or imprisonment.

No-Publicity Policy Formed on State's Grants to Students

The Oregon High School-College Relations Council unanimously adopted a resolution at its annual spring meeting in Eugene April 26 that names of students who receive financial aid should not be made public.

The group consisting of representatives of all public and private, two and four-year colleges and representatives from secondary education, concluded that financial aid based on need is a confidential matter between the organization or institution and the student involved. The resolution adopted states that institutions should "respect the privacy of the individual receiving all forms of financial assistance which is based on need. Names should not be published or publicized in any manner on bulletin boards, news releases, or at commencement."

Jeffrey M. Lee, executive director of the State Scholarship Commission, last week made the same request to all Oregon secondary schools. Lee strongly commended the resolutions saying, "there is no reason why we should publicize the fact that the student's parents do not have sufficient financial resources to support his education beyond high school. We are not slighting the student, we are merely respecting him."

Poisonings Take Toll of Children

Nearly 1,000 Oregon children under the age of 5 years were poisoned accidentally last year, and three died.

Child poisonings in recent months are on the increase, according to state health reports. Two deaths have already occurred this year. A 2-year-old Ashland girl drank a half-teaspoon of candle dye, and a 21-month-old Albany boy ate several diet capsules.

Dr. Edward Press, state health officer, has issued this special appeal to parents for greater precautions against poisonings at home:

"I urge every parent of a youngster just starting to walk to give particular attention to these warnings. Look carefully around your own house. Wherever you see any items that could be harmful if eaten, put them well out of a youngster's reach."

Dr. Press cited medicines, especially aspirin, as being most often involved in child poisoning accidents. Next most frequent are common household articles such as washing and cleaning agents, polishes, paints, insecticides and cosmetics.

OSU Will Exceed 50,000 Degree Total on June 2

The 50,000-degree mark will be passed by Oregon State University at its 99th annual commencement Sunday, June 2.

The total through 1967 was 49,597, including 384 "certificates" awarded during the early years of the university, Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning.

One-seventh of the 49,597 degrees have been conferred during the past three years by President James H. Jensen, including a record 2,441 last June. This year's total will be considerably larger.

OSU granted its first three degrees in June, 1870, but it took until 1890 to reach the 100-degree mark. The first graduating class to number more than 1,000 was the post-world War II veteran-filled class of 1948.

More students have been graduated since 1955 than during the previous 85 years, university officials pointed out in noting the tremendous advances in Oregon education.

Now in its 100th year, OSU will officially begin its Centennial Observance this fall. The "Class of the Century" will be graduated a year from now.

Two Students Make EOC Honor List

Two undergraduate students at Eastern Oregon College from Heppner are on the Dean's List for the winter term at the college, according to Lyle H. Johnson, dean of students.

The two are Brenda Young, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harley Young, and Tim Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Smith, now of Yakima.

Students on the dean's list are those whose academic achievement is rated as outstanding for the term. It requires a grade point average of 3.50 or better.
