Grain Schools Are Scheduled

Grain industry people will have an opportunity to receive instruction in grain sampling and grading techniques at schools being arranged by the Grain Division of the Oregon Department of Agriculture at three locations.

The school will give those participating an opportunity to use the division's grain triers, dockage testers and sieves and to make grade determinations. Growers, as well as handlers and processors, are being encouraged to attend.

The division will supply instructional personnel. Also present will be a staff member from the U. S. Department of Agriculture's grain division field offices at Portland.
One of the sessions will be Thursday, May 23, at 9 a.m., Vert Memorial Auditorium, Pendleton.
