Couple Plans Church Wedding Sunday

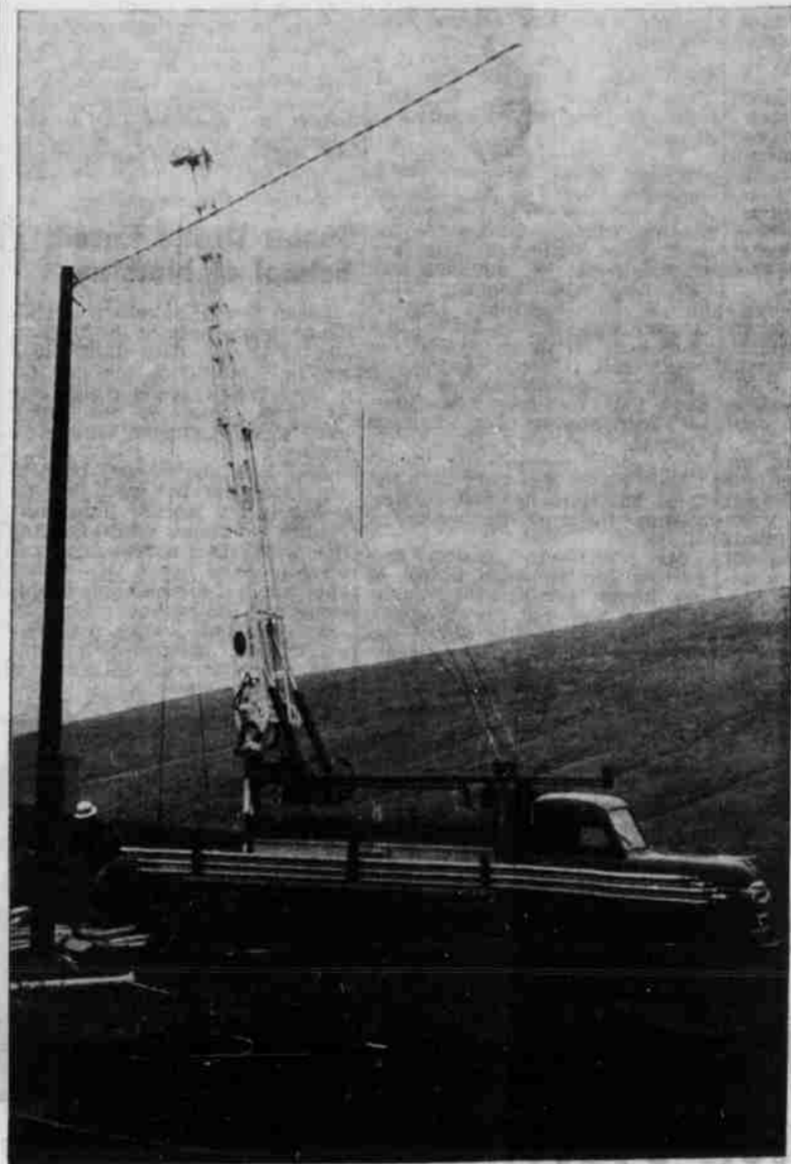
