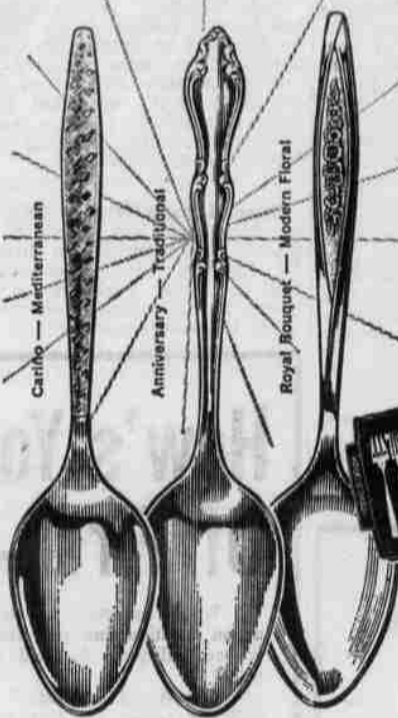
Forty-eight youth members turned out to participate in the joint meeting. Refreshments were served following the worship period.

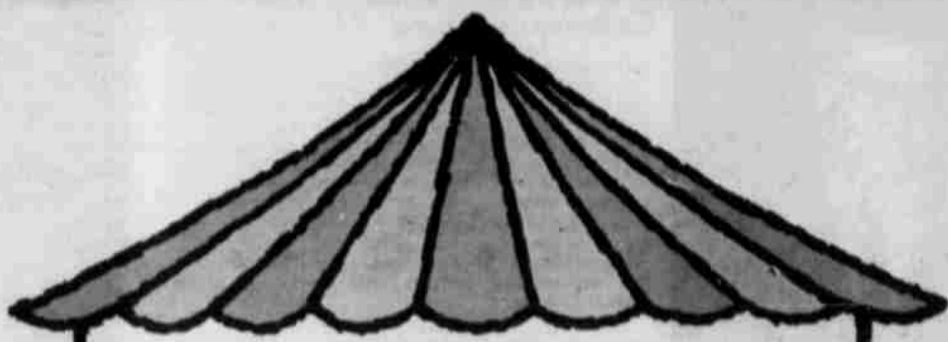

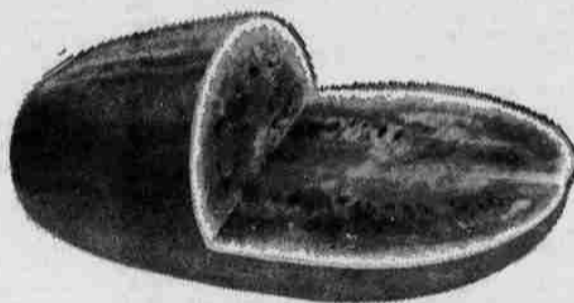
