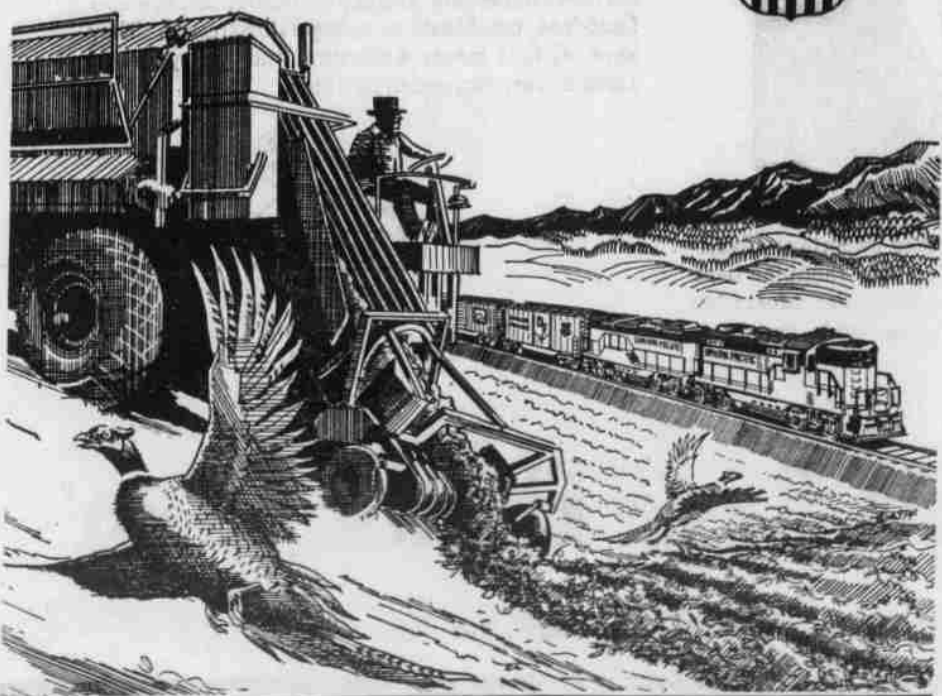
Miss Conner and Mr. Benson are both graduates of Wheeler County High school.
