IRRIGON—The end of a long struggle to acquire a municipal water system for the City of Irrigon appears to be near. A call for bids for drilling of the well is being advertised and revenue bonds are currently being offered for sale to finance a part of the project. A \$26,700 Federal grant through Farmers Home Administration will also assist in defraying the cost. The regular council meeting on July 9 was set for opening of bids on both well contract and bonds and, according to Mayor Chester Wilson, the drilling contract is scheduled to be awarded the following week with work to begin in 15 days. Mrs. Marilyn Stewart, who was named recorder pro tem in the absence of Mrs. Creamer, will receive bid documents for the City. Contracts for the distribution system and well equipment will be advertised and awarded later in the season after a water source is assured and well cost has been determined. Location of the well will be at 7th and Oregon, where a ground-breaking ceremony is being considered for later in July.
