County Registers 318 House Trailers

Oregon counties will share this year in more than \$2,200,000 collected in license fees from house trailer owners by the Department of Motor Vehicles since May, 1967.

This year's total of \$2,279,993 is \$258,156 more than was distributed in 1967. Morrow county shows 318 trailer applications with fees totaling \$10,109.41.

Monies are distributed according to the trailer's location shown on the registration application.

The amount is based on 73,691 house trailer applications processed by the Department from May 1 last year through April 30 this year. Last year's distribution was based on 66,252 applications processed.

Counties receiving more than \$100,000 are Multnomah, \$280,041; Lane, \$259,530; Clackamas, \$216,928; Marion, \$154,711; Jackson, \$154,081; Washington, \$122,681; and Douglas, \$118,758.

City Well Bids Above Estimate

IRRIGON—Bids were opened at the regular council meeting last Tuesday evening on drilling a well for the City.

Of the two proposals submitted, R. J. Strasser of Portland was apparent low bidder, with an offer of \$13,344 for work on both the exploratory and production phases of the job. The only other proposal was from Chas. Jugmann Drilling Co. of Walla Walla with a \$20,032 offer. Both bids were above the engineers estimate of \$8,000.

Bid estimates were forwarded to Cornell, Howland, Hayes & Merryfield of Seattle, who are engineering the project for the city, for their analysis and recommendations. Duplicate items required on the bid sheets account for some of the excess amount of the proposals. A special meeting of the council has been scheduled this week for considering the engineers recommendations, awarding the contract, and discussing other aspects of the proposed system.

Norm Schroth, representing Schroth Insurance Agency, was present to discuss the tort law which affects governmental immunity of public bodies, and which took effect July 1 of this year. He explained the bearing this law may have upon the city's insurance coverage.

No bids were received in answer to a call for bids on a \$36,000 revenue bond issue for construction of a water system and a resolution was adopted offering these bonds for sale to Farmers Home Administration. A \$26,700 grant has been approved by this agency to assist in financing the project.
