Columbia Project Study Underway

Congressman Al Ullman reports that the Bureau of Reclamation is starting preliminary field work as a reconnaissance study of the Columbia South Side Project, the largest reclamation project ever proposed in Oregon.

The study will include lands along the Columbia River in northern Morrow and Gilliam counties, between the John Day and Umatilla Rivers. The major task of the reconnaissance study will be land classification, and Ullman said the Bureau of Reclamation's Salem office is now contacting the owners of all private lands and agencies leasing public lands to secure permission for field crews to enter and make the required field examinations.

The study area will contain about 300,000 irrigable acres, including some in the Navy's Boardman Bombing and Gunnery range. Ullman was able to secure an appropriation of \$41,300 to cover the cost of the study.
