Traffic Safety Commission Warns Of Hydroplaning

Hydroplaning . . . skimming along the surface . . . is a desired thing in boating circles, but on the highway it can mean complete loss of control, according to the Oregon Traffic Safety Commission.
 "All of a sudden there was nothing to get hold of. In these anguished terms, a driver described what happened moments before his car skidded off a wet road, plunged down an embankment and overturned. Upon investigation, the evidence pointed to a hydroplaning skid as the cause of the accident."
 The Commission noted today that motorists should be familiar with the principles of hydroplaning and should consider its inherent dangers as another important inducement to reduce speed when confronted with certain driving conditions on a wet highway.
 Hydroplaning can begin at speeds above 30 miles per hour. As acceleration is increased, a film of water develops at the point of contact which the tires can no longer penetrate. When this happens, the tires begin to ride up or "plane" on this film in the way that skis "plane" on a surface of water. At about 55 mph, the tires are totally supported by the water, and friction for braking or accelerating has disappeared.
 Unfortunately for the individual driver, the traffic safety agency concluded, there is no sure-fire method of avoiding a hydroplaning skid. About the best general advice that can be given is: in wet weather, slow down below the hydroplaning speed when approaching curves or other changes in pitch or incline in the road. If hydroplaning should occur, decelerate immediately, and wait for the tires to regain traction. Stay off the brakes! In the case of partial hydroplaning, correcting for the individual type of skid may bring the car under control.
