Heppner to Open At Grant Union

 Heppner High hoopers open the basketball season Saturday, December 7, at John Day against the Grant Union Prospectors. This will be the first game in the Prospectors' new gym.

Grant Union will really be out for revenge when the Prospectors meet the Mustangs. Heppner defeated the Prospectors in the finals at the 7-A2 district tourney at La Grande last year. The Mustangs were twice beaten in the regular season by Grant Union but pulled through in the clutch to whip them for a state tournament berth.

Since then, Heppner has lost six men by graduation, but the Prospectors have lost ten. Heppner has two returning starters plus a couple more boys with some varsity experience. Grant Union has one returning letterman, Dave Dieker. In Dieker the Prospectors have a very refined ballplayer who gathered all-state mention on the Oregonian second team. Dave, standing about 6'4", will be the Prospectors' strongest threat. Not to be forgotten are last year's Prospect junior varsity players who were 18-0 for the season and on several occasions ran up scores with three digits.

The Mustangs' starting five probably won't be revealed until minutes before the opening tipoff. Coach Clough is very optimistic about his Mustangs; many of his cagers are showing a lot of potential and re-sure.

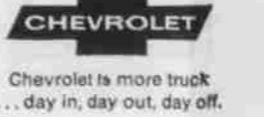
