

**'Enjoy Your Home' Is New 4-H Theme For Coming Project**

A new project for 4-H club members in Umatilla and Morrow counties, "Enjoy Your Home", is available for both boys and girls from age 9 through age 18.

According to Mary Speckhart, county extension agent, one of the project requirements is to re-do, repair, or make something new that will add pleasure, utility or convenience to the club member's home.

Taking this project does not need to cost much money, since the requirements are extremely flexible. Older boys and girls (ages 12 through 18) will also learn how to make their money go farthest when shopping for items needed in their homes. In the senior project, the costs of credit will be investigated.

The project incorporates a wide range of activity. Working with color, texture and design creates a new awareness and appreciation of the world around us. Pleasant, safe surroundings result from improvement of storage, better lighting, proper use of cleaning products and equipment, and knowledge of electrical safety.

Leaders for this project may be either men or women. An ideal combination would be a man and his wife. Leaders do not need to possess any special skill, but must be interested in helping boys and girls. Other adults are available in most communities to assist the club members with the skills they need to complete individual projects. A wide range of written information has been assembled by Oregon State University extension specialists for the leaders to use with club members.

Men or women who are interested in being leaders for this project, or boys and girls interested in enrolling, should call or visit the local county extension office to learn more about the "Enjoy Your Home" project.
