

Oregon Drivers Warned of '3 D's' For New Years

As plans develop for New Year's celebrations, Oregon drivers would do well to give thought to the three D's... drinking, drugs and darkness with a trio that courts disaster with a dismal song of danger, warns an Oregon Traffic Safety official.

Howard L. Eddy, OTSC Executive Secretary said "we estimate that in Oregon approximately 60% of all fatal accidents

on our streets and highways are flavored with intoxicants." "Less clearly defined, but a recognized factor, as an influence in car crashes is the use of drugs," he pointed out.

The traffic safety authority noted that some of the drugs carry a label warning against their use before driving. But how many users who are sensitive to drugs are sensible enough to heed this admonition? How many dare to mix drugs with drink, and then drive?

"The two-drink driver who adds a tranquilizer to his alcoholic intake may find himself

as wobbly and blurred in vision as if he had had six or eight drinks," Eddy warned.

"Every night from now through New Year's Eve there will be parties galore at which drinks will be served," he said.

"Some of the people attending these holiday events will drink more than usual and still attempt to drive home in the darkness of night, when visibility is restricted. If bad weather prevails, the dangers of rain, sleet, snow and ice further threaten the homeward-bound motorists."

The Oregon traffic safety of-

ficial concluded:

"Hosts have an obligation to make certain that any guest who 'has had too much' is given a ride home in a taxi or with a guest who can operate a motor vehicle without jeopardizing life.

"If the over-imbibed guest ob-

jects to this hospitable act, it's better to lose him as a friend than have him added to our state's growing toll.

"This is the season of goodwill to all men. Unless we exercise good judgment in driving matters, we are not exhibiting goodwill."
