

3-Month Program To Include Studies On Food, Life Saving

Home Extension units in Umatilla and Morrow counties will have a varied program over the next three months, reports Home Agent Molly Saul. During January, February, and March Mrs. Gordon George, advisory committee member from Pendleton, and Home Agent Molly Saul will visit each unit to present a study lesson. Mrs. George will teach the Red Cross lesson on "Mouth-to-Mouth Resuscitation," and Mrs. Saul will present a lesson on "Trends in Food Packaging." The units will also study a lesson of their own selection during the three-month period.

Mrs. George will present a film on mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and will explain the vital need for all teen-agers and adults to learn this life saving technique. She will take a life-size doll to each unit, in order that each member may practice the method. Mrs. George has been certified by the American Red Cross to teach this important lesson.

Mrs. Saul will explain and show examples of the many changes taking place in the food packaging industry. She will explain how packages benefit consumers, state and federal packaging regulations, comparison of various packaging costs and future trends in food packaging. She will also explain the part the average homemaker or consumer may play in influencing manufacturers.

All homemakers are invited to attend the unit in her locality—in Rhea Creek, January 8; in Pine City, January 15, and in Heppner, January 20.
