Shoppers Invited To Take Course
 Food shoppers who are interested in getting the most from their meat dollar are invited by County Extension Agent Molly Saul to sign up for a free correspondence course on meat buying. This course, entitled "You—The Informed Meat Buyer," is open to all shoppers in Umatilla and Morrow counties.
 The correspondence course will include material on: identification of cuts of beef, lamb, and pork; meat grades and how to recognize quality; federal and state meat inspection regulations; cost per serving of the various meat cuts; seasonal supply and seasonal demand for meat; and basic principles of meat cooking. Economy hints on both meat buying and meat cooking will be emphasized.
 Free Oregon State University and United States Department of Agriculture bulletins will be distributed with each assignment.
 Lesson material has been written by Velma Seat, Food Marketing Specialist, Oregon State University. Assignments

will be distributed, read, and handled by Home Agent Molly Saul in the Pendleton County Extension Office. Certificates of completion of the OSU correspondence course, signed by Gene Lear, Director of Extension, and Mrs. Saul, will be distributed at the completion of all assignments.
 The course will start Monday, February 10, and continue through a period of ten weeks. There will be five assignments, spaced two weeks apart.
