## Sheep Producers Urged to Attend Showing of Film

A meeting of interest to all sheep producers has been scheduled for Tuesday, January 28, starting at 7:30 p.m. in the dormitory building on the Morrow County Fairgrounds.

Main feature of the program will be a New Zealand film, entitled "Good Shepherding". The basic concept of the film deals with lambing and what can be done to obtain a higher percentage of sections on feeding, ewe health, difficult births, and sheep handling equipment.

The film is a straightforward, unglamorized, and realistic look at most of the complications found in a flock of ewes. One of the real interesting parts of the film is centered around the use of sheep's skeleton, along with an anesthetized lamb, showing the various abnormal positions that a lamb can be in at the time of birth.

Henry Krebs of Ione, vice-president of the newly reorganized Oregon Sheep Producers Association, will be present to discuss the work of his organization and answer questions concerning membership.

The meeting will conclude with a discussion of the Morrow County Wool Pool.
