Landowners Favor Pumping Project By 6 to 1 Margin

IRRIGON—Results of the election of the West Extension Irrigation District, held Friday in the district office here, to determine if pumping facilities for supplemental water should be installed, shows landowners favor the move over 6 to 1. Of the 96 ballots cast, 83 endorsed the measure and 13 were against it.
The plan calls for installing three 600 hp. pumps in the backwater of the Umatilla river and lifting the water 150 feet into the districts canal which skirts the brow of the hill southwest of the City of Umatilla. This continues west for 27 miles and supplies lands from this point, through the Irrigon area and on to Boardman. Engineering was done by Tudor Engineering Company of San Francisco. Bids for construction, opened a week ago, shows the low bid was submitted by Godwin Construction Company of Hermiston for \$133,000. Contracts will be let in the near future with construction completion set for June 1.

This favorable expression by district landowners comes after experiencing an exceptionally dry season a year ago, and after a series of group meetings seeking a solution for the water shortage in the area. At one such meeting in Hermiston, which was attended by Representative Al Ullman, an appeal was made for assistance and through his efforts, surplus pumps belonging to the government were located and made available to the district through a grant.

An informative meeting, which was attended by about 80 people, was held two days prior to the election, at which time the program was explained and cost breakdown given. Questions posed by the group were answered by Manager Max Jones, who stressed the fact that a great saving to the district would be realized by accepting the offer while these pumps are available. The certainty that demands for assured water on old lands will increase, and these, coupled with pressures for developing new lands, will dictate that some type of project be constructed soon, if not done now.

Since the district has \$120,000 of its own funds available for use on the project, outside funds in the amount of only \$40,000 need be borrowed for the construction and initial operational costs. Total cost of \$150,000 would be charged against the lands for repayment in the following manner: \$50,000 against the 6,000 acres of old irrigated land and \$100,000 against 2,000 acres of new land which would be sprinkled, both to have a repayment span of 20 years. Operational and repayment costs of \$1.42 per acre above the present assessment of \$4.50 would result in a total annual cost of \$5.92 per acre for old lands. The 2,000 acres of new land would bear its share of construction at the rate of \$50 per acre, one-third of which would be paid the first year, or \$16.67. The remaining two-thirds, paid over a 20-year period at the rate of \$1.67 per acre per year, plus operation cost of \$6.00 and the same present rate of \$4.50 as for old lands, would result in an annual per acre cost of \$12.17 after the first year.

While Jones admits some inequities do exist, the plan, which allows for more pumps to be added and expansion in the future, appears the most feasible under present circumstances and within the framework of present controls.

Jones also pointed out that pumping facilities and pipelines for delivering water from the canal to the users land must be constructed by, and at the expense of, the individual owner.

Patrons casting ballots in Friday's election were limited to those owning four or more acres of land covered by a water right. With approval of the measure, an area which has struggled over a 60 year period, sometimes for its very existence, will receive a new lease on life.
