## Vehicle Owners' Address Changes Require Notice

The Department of Motor Vehicles has a problem with people who fail to notify it of a change of address.

Vern L. Hill, director of the department, today urged Oregon drivers and car owners to comply with the law which requires them to notify in writing the DMV within 30 days after the change of address.

Compliance with the law, Hill said, will help insure that owners and drivers are reminded to renew their licenses as well as help cut operating costs in the licensing agency.

The Department, which must be one of the post office's best Oregon customers, mails approximately 80,000 passenger car renewal reminders and about 40,000 driver license renewal reminders each month.

About 1700 notices are returned each week which the post office cannot deliver because people have moved and left no forwarding address and have not notified the department of the move. Hill said the post office department also forwards about 7,000 notices a month. These are to people who have left no forwarding addresses with the post office, but have not changed their addresses on DMV records, Hill said.

Failure to notify the department of a change of address is a misdemeanor and is punishable, upon conviction, by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or both.

The Department hopes more people will comply voluntarily, rather than run the risk of a citation and fine.

## Auto Deaths Down; Morrow Has Two

Twenty-one of Oregon's 36 counties recorded fewer traffic deaths in 1968 than in 1967, according to the Oregon Department of Motor Vehicles. The state's tentative death toll for the year is 645, about 1 1/2 per cent lower than in 1967.

Morrow county recorded two deaths in 1968 as compared with three in 1967.

Twelve counties had higher traffic tolls than the previous year and two counties, Washington and Wasco, had the same number of deaths in both years. Counties with decreases were Benton, Clackamas, Coos, Crook, Deschutes, Douglas, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Hood River, Jackson Lane, Marion, Morrow, Multnomah, Polk, Sherman, Tillamook, Umatilla, Union and Wheeler. Wheeler was the only traffic death-free county in 1968.

Counties recording increases last year were Baker, Clatsop, Columbia, Curry, Jefferson, Josephine, Klamath, Lake, Lincoln, Linn, Malheur, Wallowa and Yamhill counties.

The department said county figures are subject to change if delayed death reports are received.

## Oregon Blue Book Coming Off Presses In 1969-70 Edition

The 1969-70 edition of the Oregon Blue Book, revamped and reorganized from cover to cover, is now coming off the presses. Secretary of State Clay Myers said today.

"Though the edition reflects several changes suggested by constant users of the Blue Book in a mail questionnaire last year," Myers said, "I believe it will prove to be the traditionally handy and reliable storehouse of information it has always been."

The advance press run of 500 copies will be distributed to state officials, members of the news media, and various governmental agencies.

An additional 19,500 will be printed for public sale and free distribution to schools, libraries and governmental offices.

The attractively designed cover features a color photograph of the Capitol on the front and a reproduction of the state seal on the back.

Myers, whose office edits the Oregon Blue Book every two years, said the price has been increased from \$1.00 to \$1.50 in accordance with a statute passed during the special session of the 1967 Legislature.

Myers said quantities of the Oregon Blue Book will be sent to the 36 county clerks for local public sale. Mail orders will be filled by the Elections Division, State Capitol, Salem.
