Daggett To Train As Naval Aviator

Lee P. Daggett, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. L. (Jerry) Daggett of Heppner, received the oath of enlistment recently following his acceptance as an aviation officer candidate at the Sand Point Naval Air Station, Seattle.

The oath was administered during ceremonies conducted by Ensign Ronald Cummins of the Sand Point recruiting department.

A 1965 graduate of Heppner High school, he is currently a senior at Oregon State University at Corvallis where he is working toward a bachelor of science degree in Business Administration.

Daggett's first duty assignment will be to the Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Fla., where he will undergo two years of flight training. Upon completion of this phase he will be commissioned an ensign and awarded the coveted "Wings of Gold" of the Naval aviator.

He expects to start training in July after graduating at OSU in June. Daggett plans to be home this weekend for a visit.

Refresher Course For Nurses Slated

The Oregon League for Nursing has announced a refresher course for registered nurses scheduled to start March 24 in Pendleton. Participating hospitals in the eight-week refresher course are St. Anthony and Pendleton Community hospitals in Pendleton; St. Joseph and Grande Ronde hospitals in La-Grande; Good Shepherd hospital, Hermiston and Pioneer Memorial hospital, Heppner.

Completion of the course fulfills the Oregon State Board of Nursing requirements for relicensure of former licensed registered nurses.

Funding of the course is through the Manpower Development and Training Act (MDTA), an on-the-job training project under the administration of the Oregon Association of Hospitals. There is no charge for the course.

Nurses wishing to take the refresher course are urged to contact the Director of Nursing in any one of the participating hospitals.
