## Topic Club Schedules Luncheon Card Party For Library Support

Continued operation of the lone Public Library is the major project of the lone Topic Club. It is through efforts of this club that annual operation costs of between \$500 and \$550 are largely met, and library doors are kept open for public use of lone residents and for school children.

On Saturday, April 12, the club will sponsor a dessert luncheon at the lone Masonic Hall, starting at 1:30 p.m. Bridge and pinochle will be in play, with door prizes and score prizes awarded. All proceeds will go to the library fund. Donations, also, from persons who will be unable to attend, but hold interest in the library, will be gratefully acknowledged.

The Topic Club, organized in June of 1930, was instrumental in establishing the library in 1935. It developed from one of the state's traveling libraries to a permanent one, presently stocked with 5,454 books on its shelves, plus good supply of current magazines and periodicals. Records of last year show that 2,851 children's books were circulated.

The library is open regularly on Monday and Thursday afternoons, and every other Wednesday morning for special use of school children.

Salary of the librarian, Mrs. Laurel Cannon, is paid by the sponsoring club, as well as the purchasing of books, magazines and periodicals, cleaning supplies and services, and insurance.

The City of lone furnishes the building, the heat and light, and \$100 toward covering annual operating expenses. Donations and money-raising project of the Topic Club fill in the remainder of the budget.

Two charter club members Mrs. Vera Rietmann and Mrs. Elaine Rietmann, are still active in promoting functions for the library. Current club president is Mrs. Norman Nelson.

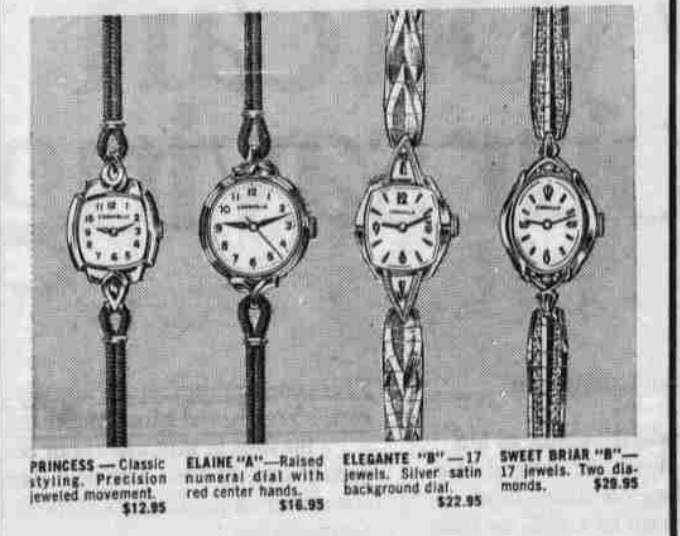
