BRONZE STAR FOR HEROISM, Purple Heart and other medals posthumously awarded Specialist 4 Ronald F. Neal are received by his father Ernest Neal, Condon, on May 1. Specialist Neal was killed by enemy gunfire in Vietnam on January 17. Making the presentation is Colonel William Whelan, commanding officer, Umatilla Army Depot.

Posthumous Award To Condon Soldier Given to Father

A Bronze Star Medal with "V" device (for valor) and Oak Leaf Cluster, awarded posthumously to Specialist 4 Ronald F. Neal, was presented to his father, Ernest Neal, at Condon on May 1.

Specialist Neal had been in the Army since 1964 and was killed on January 17 by enemy fire while manning a 25th Infantry Division tank in Vietnam. His funeral was held two weeks later in Enterprise, where he had been born 22 years ago. Mrs. Myrtle Hinkle, Arlington, is his mother.

His son's Purple Heart, Good Conduct, Vietnam Service, National Defense Service and Vietnam Campaign Medals also were presented to Neal by Colonel William J. Whelan, commanding officer of Umatilla Army Depot.

A sister of Specialist Neal and officials of the depot also were present at the ceremony.

Citation accompanying the young soldier's Bronze Star Medal read:

"For heroism in connection with military operations against a hostile force: Specialist 4 Neal distinguished himself by heroic actions on 17 January 1969, while serving with A Troop, 3rd Squadron, 4th Cavalry, in the Republic of Vietnam. While conducting a sweep mission, A Troop suddenly came under intense enemy fire from an unknown-sized enemy force. Specialist Neal was performing his job inside the tank, loading the main gun, when the .50 caliber machine gun suddenly quit firing. With complete disregard for his own safety, Specialist Neal

leaped on top of the tank, exposing himself to the deadly Viet Cong fire, and repaired the machine gun. While climbing back into the turret to continue loading the main gun, Specialist Neal was fatally wounded. Specialist Neal's personal bravery, aggressiveness and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, the 25th Infantry Division, and the United States Army."

Jackson C. Calvin Dies at Anchorage

Jackson C. Calvin, 84, former Heppner resident, died May 9, after several months illness, at Ridgeview Manor Nursing Home in Anchorage, Alaska, according to information received here by O. A. Minton.

Mr. Calvin was born February 6, 1885. He served in the U. S. Navy from 1903 to 1907, and retired from General Hospital in Kansas City, Mo. He came to Heppner in 1958 to make his home with the late Richard C. Calvin and family. In 1960 the family moved to Alaska to make their home, and Mrs. Marguerite Calvin continues to make her home in Anchorage.
