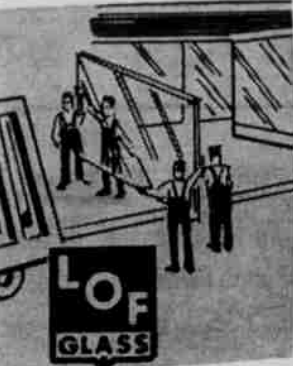

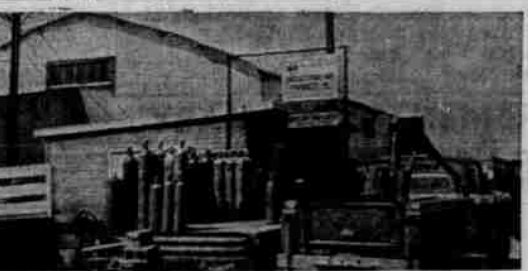

It is called the Columbia 660 irrigation system and it is a self propelled sprinkler that can cover 160 acres of steep and uneven land or level land with a minimum of attention, and spraying from 600

to 1700 GPM.

It can be set to cover a section of land in 6 to 60 hours, and the 6 hour set will give wind and frost control.

The system comes in two sizes—a 40-acre size or up to 160-acre size, and both will irrigate at approximately same cost per acre. Several local farms are now using this revolutionary new system and if you will call Ross Machine, Mr. Ross will be pleased to show some installations.
