Her major responsibilities have included the 4-H Home Economics program and working with older 4-Hers in the Junior Leader and Empire Builders program. In her new position with the Oregon Dairy Council, starting August 1, Miss Speckhart will be doing educational and promotional work with the dairy

industry. She will be working out of the Council's Portland office.

Hagelstein expects a replacement for the position to be announced in the near future. He said Miss Speckhart has been highly effective in her work with 4-H and youth programs in Umatilla and Morrow counties, and expressed regrets at her leaving.

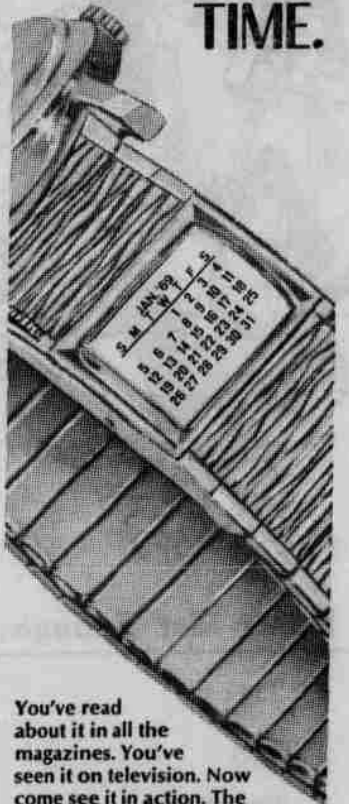
