### **Bank Debits Climb** In Eastern Counties

Bank debits for the Eastern Oregon area, including Gilliam, Grant, Morrow, Umatilla and Wheeler countles, increased in June, 1969, compared to June, 1968; the University of Oregon Bureau of Business and Econom-ic Research has reported. Debits for June, 1969, totaled \$62,442,000; for May, 1969, the total was \$57,830,000 and for June, 1968, the total was \$54,-114,000. Oregon with 346 banks report-

Oregon with 346 banks report-ing had a percentage increase of 3.5 in June, 1969, compared with May, 1969, and a 36.5 per-centage increase in June, 1969, compared with June, 1968.
