After the impoundment, owners of unauthorized cattle may regain possession thereof only by first showing proof of ownership and reimbursing the United States in full for the expense incurred in impounding, feeding, and care of such cattle. All impounded animals not redeemed within 5 days after impoundment will be offered for sale at public auction. Animals not sold at public sale may be sold at private sale or condemned and destroyed, or otherwise disposed of as provided by Regulation 36 C.F.R. 261.13.

Total bank debts for June, 1969, come to \$4,728,516,000. For May, 1969, the total was \$4,565,928,000, and for June, 1968, the total was \$3,462,046,000.
