NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING PREVENTION OF FEDERAL TIMBER SUBSTITUTION FOR NON-FEDERAL LOG EXPORTS

The Chief of the Forest Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Director of the Bureau of Land Management, U. S. Department of the Interior, propose to hold a hearing on a plan to implement further measures authorized under Part IV of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1968 which restricts the quantity of timber which may be sold for export from the United States from Federal lands located west of the 100th meridian.

Section 2 (c) of Part IV of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1968 states that the Secretaries of the Departments administering Federal lands referred to in the Act may issue rules and regulations to carry out the purpose of the Act in regard to timber export control, including the prevention of substitution of timber restricted from export under the Act for exported non-Federal timber.

A joint public advisory hearing will be held in the Auditorium, Bonneville Power Administration Building, 1002 N. E. Holladay Street, Portland, Oregon 97232, beginning at 10 a.m. P.T., Friday, September 26, 1969.

Interested people are invited to review the proposed plan for implementing restrictions prohibiting the substitution of export restricted Federal timber. Comments and advice are sought on the desirability of implementing the proposed plan through subsequent rules and regulations.

Copies of the proposed plan may be secured from the Regional Forester, 319 S. W. Pine Street, P. O. Box 3623, Portland, Oregon 97208, or the State Director Bureau of Land Management, 729 N. E. Oregon Street, P. O. Box 2965, Portland, Oregon 97208.

The record of the hearing will remain open for thirty days following the hearing for the inclusion of additional written statements. These should be submitted within the specified time limit in quadruplicate to the Regional Forester, P. O. Box 3623, Portland, Oregon 97208, or to the State Director Bureau of Land Management, P. O.
