Willard Blake, former Heppner resident, has become the new Assistant Dean of Students in charge of student financial aids at Oregon College of Education in Monmouth.

Blake, after attending the U of Portland for a time upon graduation from high school in Heppner, served in the Armed Forces during World War II then entered the business field returning to school at Oregon College of Education in 1964 where he received his B. A. degree in 1967. This was followed with a Masters degree the following year.

Presently an instructor in the Education - Psychology department, Blake will succeed David Trapp who has resigned for advanced study at the University of Washington.

Blake, who specialized in guidance and counseling in his Masters program at OCE, will be in charge of evaluating applications for student loans, grants, scholarships, and the college work-study program for OCE and will advise students seeking financial aid.
