**Team Overpowers Condon Saturday**

Ending preseason clashes in style, the Heppner High Mustangs walloped Condon 20-6 in a road game Saturday, September 27.

The outstanding fact about the game was how hard the Horsemen were hitting on both offense and defense. Coach Hiemstra commented that it was the hardest the Mustangs have hit in the previous four years.

Gary Watkins in his second start as Mustang quarterback, did a remarkable job of mixing pass plays with a consistent running game.

Condon was the first to get on the scoreboard, capitalizing on a blocked punt, which they recovered on the Heppner 15-yard line.

Boyer and Weatherford, carrying the ball on alternating plays, gained one first down which brought them to the Mustang five. Boyer then carried the ball in for the Blue Devils. The PAT failed, with the score early in the first quarter 6-0, Condon prevailing.

Dean Wright received the Condon kickoff and carried the ball from the Mustang 10-yard line to their 25. On the next play Dean saw a line of Mustang blockers that never seemed to end. He ran the ball 75 yards to paydirt. Watkins attempted a pass for a 2-point PAT that failed. This evened up the tally, 6-all.

John Hall and Lee Huson put a lot of pressure on Condon's strong workhorses, Boyer and Weatherford, throughout Condon's next few drives. Condon threatened only once more in the first half, this time to the Mustang 35-yard line.

Penalties hit the Mustangs, but they scored again, this time in the second quarter, on a 45-yard aerial from Watkins to senior scatback John McCabe. A bad snap on the extra point try forfeited the Mustangs' chances at extra points.

This concluded scoring in the first half with the Mustangs ahead for the first time in the ball game, 12-6.

The Mustang gridders' only score in the third panel was started on a 45-yard drive. Two first downs set up a final 2-yard drive by John Hall over left tackle. A 2-point play, a pass from McCabe to Hall, ended the scoring for the afternoon.

The visiting Mustangs tallied 20, Condon 6.

Coach Hiemstra was enthusiastic after the ball game. He commented that his offense was beginning to click, both his offensive and defensive line performed remarkably well, and that his linebackers did better than they had in previous encounters.

Nabbing game honors were Bruce Marquardt, outstanding offensive lineman; John Hall, offensive back; Lee Huson, defensive lineman; and Dean Wright, defensive back.

The Mustangs' next encounter will be on their home field, October 3, with Pilot Rock at 8 p.m. This will be their first league game.

**Cards Taste Win In Vernon Game**

"It was a great team effort," Coach Gordon Meyers said of his squad after its win over Mt. Vernon on the home turf Friday afternoon.

The Cardinals scored seven touchdowns in three of the four quarters to overpower their opponents 52-22.

But it had its costs.

A senior, Scott Wilson, who was developing into one of the bright spots in the thinly decked Cards, failed to get to his feet after a hard tackle in the 3rd quarter. His right leg was fractured, and he will be out for the rest of the season, and perhaps into basketball.

Also, another veteran, Gene Crowell, will be out of action for an indefinite time with a badly sprained knee, the coach lamented.

Action this week brings the Riverside Pirates hunting for a win against the Ione club Friday afternoon, 2:30, on Memorial field.

"Riverside, along with Weston, will be shooting for the title this year," Meyers predicted. The Pirates have a good share of returning strength, and their experience has been showing.

But with three games under their belt, and tasting a good share of scoring in the last game, the Cards will be out to pull an upset.

The Ione boys started early Friday to execute plays and gain good yardage.

In the first quarter three players scored. Scott Wilson showed speed in a 52-yard run early in the quarter to score, and a two-point conversion followed. Doug Beggs touched the ball down in the end zone three times, first in the first quarter on a 52-yard sweep. Terry Cannon punched across one yard for the third TD.

Mt. Vernon held tight the second quarter, and were successful in scoring once on a 5-yard run.

At half time Ione held the comfortable lead, 24-6.

Each team scored 8 points in the 3rd quarter, and fought on even terms in a back-and-forth battle. For Ione, Beggs outran opponents on a 36-yard blast to the end zone, and a Mt. Vernon player evened the quarter on a 19-yard run.

Taking on reserve energy, Ione played good ball during the fourth quarter, with three individuals scoring. Dick Snider scrambled across from two yards out; Beggs got away again for a 45-yard score, and Herbie Ekstrom snatched a 22-yard pass from Snider for the last score of the game.
