My Recipe for a 4-H Leader

The 4-H leaders are the backbone of our 4-H clubs. To sum it all up, I have a recipe for a full-fledged 4-H leader:

Take 12 full months of 4-H work; divide each of these months into 28, 30, or 31 parts. Prepare one meeting at a time as follows:

Into each meeting put 12 parts of togetherness, 11 parts of responsibility, 10 parts of getting to know you, 9 parts of courage, 8 parts of work (some omit this ingredient and so spoil the rest), 7 parts of loyalty, 6 of personality, 5 of kindness, 4 of recreation (leaving this out is like leaving the oil out of the salad) 3 of special activities, 2 of refreshments and 1 of touring each member's projects.

To this add a dash of fun, a sprinkle of play, and a cupful of good humor. Pour into the whole mixture lots of leadership and mix with vim. Cook thoroughly with fervent heat, garnish with smiles and a sprig of joy. Serve with greatness, unselfishness, and cheerfulness. Happy 4-H members are sure to be the result.

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Ten Simple Safety Rules Help Reduce Gun Accidents

Oregon's hunters will be safer in the woods this season if they will practice simple gun safety rules and remember to handle the gun as if it were loaded at all times.

According to Edward J. Slezak, professor of recreation at Oregon State University, from 600 to 800 hunters in the U. S. will be killed and thousands of others injured this year simply because the man behind the gun was careless.

Slezak noted that over 10 million people will hunt this year. Of those having gun accidents, one-half will be under 25 years of age and nearly one-third will be in the 15-19 age group.

According to the latest available figures, more than half of the accidents involve shotguns; one third involve rifles; with six percent coming from hand guns. There are six non-fatal accidents to each fatality, Slezak pointed out.

To help reduce these accidents, Slezak offers ten simple gun safety reminders.

1. Always carry the gun with full control of the muzzle.
2. Keep the safety on until ready to shoot.
3. See the target before shooting.
4. Unload gun when climbing fences or trees.
5. Never carry a loaded gun into a car, home or camp.
6. Never leave a gun unattended unless it is unloaded.
7. Never point a gun at anything the hunter doesn't want to shoot.
8. Check the barrel and action before loading.
9. Never shoot at hard surfaces that cause the bullet to ricochet.
10. Remember that alcohol and guns don't mix.

This is National 4-H Week (October 5 to 11).
