

World Service Four-H Programs Get Wide Support

International service projects aid development and understanding through a cooperative effort between 4-H and people of other countries. Some of the opportunities are studied in this section.

Program Support: Financial and material support is needed for projects being developed by IFYE's, Youth Development Project delegates, Peace Corps volunteers, and other groups in various countries. For further information contact the State International Program Leader.

Jamaica 4-H Training Centers: Six 4-H training centers are being organized in Jamaica. These centers will be used for demonstration projects and leadership training. Local 4-H groups can provide for material needs. Land and buildings have been provided by the government. For complete information, write NAT-FOUR.

4-H CARE Program: Through 4-H CARE, members can contribute to the progress of world-wide 4-H type programs. Contributions promote food production, nutrition, needed tools and support materials. Queries and contributions are sent to 4-H CARE Programs, 660 First Avenue, New York, New York 10016.

World Hunger: Ever considered "A Walk for Development?" This is a unique way of becoming personally involved in raising contributions to aid in battling world-wide hunger problems. International Farm Youth Exchange Program

IFYE is 4-H's pioneer international program. Each year some 100 U. S. young people live and work with host families, schools and 4-H type programs in about 35 countries, while a similar number of exchange students from these countries are living with American families. IFYE's make important contributions to youth educational programs around the world.

Requirements: Delegates must be 20 to 30 years of age, single, in good health, have a minimum of a high school education, a rural background, and experience with 4-H or similar youth programs. Knowledge of a foreign language is helpful.

Application is made through State 4-H Offices. While all nominations for 1969 have been made, applications for 1970 exchanges will be accepted by most states up to August 15.

Cost: Each state contributes \$1,000 per delegate. The remaining \$2,000 to \$3,000 required for the two way exchange is raised by the National 4-H Club Foundation. This covers all the delegate's expenses, except those of a personal nature.

Host Family Opportunities: Area and county 4-H programs may be a part of IFYE by serving as hosts to one or more exchange students this year. Exchanges are usually in the United States from May through October, living about three weeks with each host family. This is an excellent way to build greater interest in international programs for all 4-H members, as well as host families. There are now 4-H type programs in over 80 countries.

IFYE Youth Development Project

The IFYE Youth Development Project is a one year team approach to assist with 4-H type programs in other countries. Delegates are assigned to one area of their host country to work with local extension counterparts. Participants in this phase

of the IFYE program are selected out of the regular IFYE applicants who have capabilities in this area and have indicated availability for 12 to 15 months. For further information write NATFOUR. ("NATFOUR" means the National 4-H Club Foundation, 7100 Connecticut Avenue, Washington, D. C. 20015), or the State 4-H Office.

Know how 4-H started in America? It began as pig and corn clubs for boys, and canning and sewing clubs for girls. Today, 4-H'ers can choose from up to 100 real-life learning experiences called "projects." They can develop their personalities; improve their skills; gain new knowledge in science, agriculture, foods and nutrition, clothing, personal development, community service, leadership. They can learn the "why's" as well as "how's" of what they do—in town as well as country, on Main Street as well as on the farm. Find out more about 4-H at your County Extension Office.

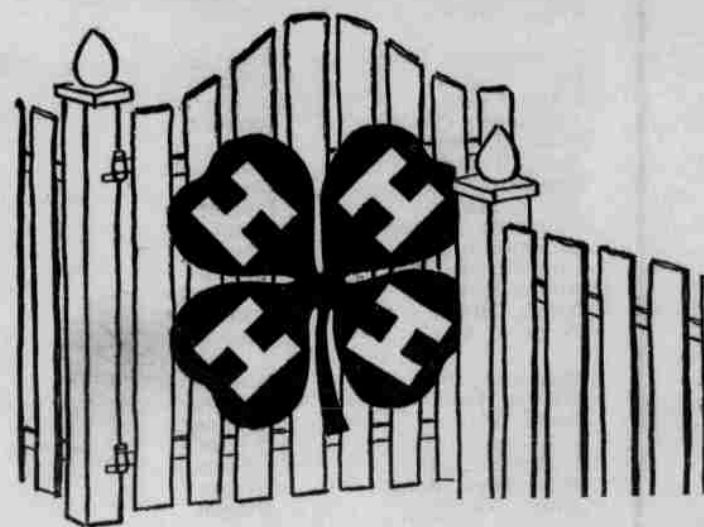
