IRRIGON Water System Ready For Hookups

IRRIGON—The Irrigon Municipal Water System is completed and the pumps were to start running Wednesday, October 8, ready for individual home owners to make their hook-up to the system.
The city engineer, Mike Hamilton, representing Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield, consulting engineers of Seattle, was here Saturday, along with the contractor, A. V. DeBlasto, of Yakima, to inspect the Awar inspection they reported to Mayor Chester Wilson that it was ready for operation. The State Board of Health also gave the go ahead signal, with requests for frequent water samples to be sent to them.
Irrigon residents are asked to contact Mrs. Ruth Coy, city clerk, when they are ready to connect with the water system. It will be necessary to pay a \$7 surety fee before the water is turned on. Some have already paid this along with the \$100 meter fee. Renters will be required to pay this surety fee when moving in and it will be refunded if and when they leave, if all water payments are paid. It is simply a precaution against non payment, to protect the city's interests.
