Larry Lindsay, secretary of the Morrow County Grain Growers board of directors, was recently re-elected a director of the North Pacific Grain Growers at Portland.

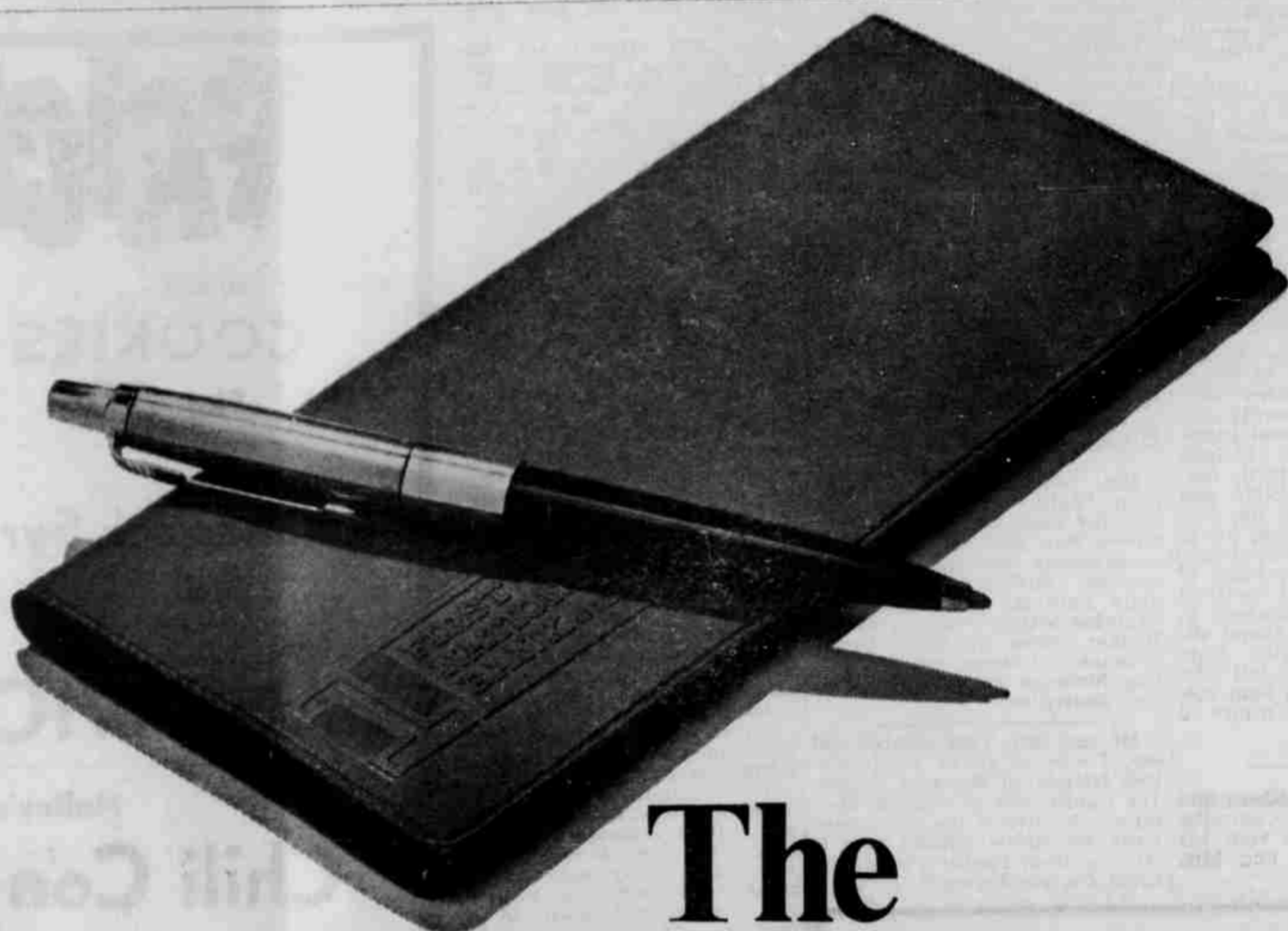
