Youth Citizenship Awards Announced By Soroptimist Club

The Soroptimist Club of Heppner wishes to announce official application forms for the Soroptimist Youth Citizenship Awards for 1970 are available at Heppner High School, through your high school advisors, to any young man or woman who will be graduating during the 1969-70 school year.

Eligibility and Qualifications:
To qualify for the awards which are judged on the merit and worth of the applicant, a student must have fulfilled the following:
SERVICE — Applicant must have taken an active part in service, in the home, in the school and in the community, with a high degree of cooperation, courtesy, and consideration for others.
DEPENDABILITY — Applicant must have executed responsibilities with truthfulness, loyalty and punctuality.

LEADERSHIP—Applicant must have demonstrated ability to lead with self-control, dignity and responsibility.
CLEAR SENSE OF PURPOSE—Applicant must have pursued selected endeavors with sincerity and integrity.
There are no specific dates set within which the applicant has met the above qualifications in school, home and community.

Requirements
The candidate must complete the Official Application for Soroptimist Youth Citizenship Awards and mail to Soroptimist Club of Heppner, Mrs. Lenna Smith, Chairman of Service and Youth Committee, Box 272, Heppner, Oregon on or before December 18, 1969.

Substantiating evidence in the form of letters written by three (ONLY 3) adult individuals not related to the candidate must accompany the application.
Awards—At the local level — The Soroptimist Club of Heppner will award a \$25.00 Savings Bond to the first place winner—\$10.00 to the second place winner, with Certificates being given to each participant entering the Awards Program.

Seventeen \$1,000 Awards will be awarded—one to each winner within the 15 Regions and 2 Affiliated Areas of the Soroptimist Federation of the Americas, Inc. and a \$1,500 FINALIST AWARD to one of the 17 winners, making a total award of \$2,500 to the finalist.
The Soroptimist Youth Citizenship Awards are not scholarships but are "Awards of Merit". WHAT'S COOKIN'?

Here is another recipe from the Seven Wonders With Beef. Swiss Steak has always been a favorite at our house but I've never tried it with the noodles. Must try it soon.

Swiss Steak Supreme
2 lbs. round steak
1/2 cup flour
1 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper
2 tbsp. salad oil
1 cup canned tomatoes
1 pkg. frozen peas
2 large onions sliced
1 pkg. (8 oz.) cooked noodles.
Cut steak into portion-size pieces. Combine flour, salt and pepper. Pound flour mixture into meat. Heat fat or oil in large skillet over low heat. Brown meat on both sides. Add tomatoes, cover and cook for about 1 hour. Add peas. Place some of onion slices on top of meat, saving as a garnish enough for 1 or 2 slices per serving. Continue to cook, covered about 1/2 hour longer or until meat and onions are fork tender. Serve on hot cooked noodles with remaining slices of onions on top of each portion of meat. Pour pan drippings over all.
