County Supervisor of Farmers Home Administration was present at the November meeting of the City Council. He reviewed operational and record keeping procedures to be carried on in connection with the completed water system, which was financed largely by this Federal Agency.

It was noted that only 30 of the required 51 water users had availed themselves of the service and it was stressed that this number was not able to produce sufficient income to meet monthly bonded debt requirements.
A special meeting is scheduled for Friday, Nov. 21, at 7:30 p.m., between the Council and the Planning Commission, to seek means to correct the situation. A total of 57 meters were installed during construction of the project.
Other business included the renewal of the class B Liquor

license presented by Dorothy Estes for the Complete Food Store. The same license application was approved for Lees' Grocery. The retainage payment was made to DeBlasio Construction of \$5,736.61 which completes all payment for construction of the water system.
The Convention of the League of Oregon Cities was discussed and it was decided that expenses would be paid for Councilman Warren McCoy to attend and to represent the City.
