

Applicators' Short Course December 15-17

What does the future hold for pesticides; what is their status now and what restrictions can applicators expect?

These are some of the questions that will be considered during sessions of the Oregon Chemical Applicators' Short Course to be presented December 15-17 at Oregon State University under the co-sponsorship of the Oregon Department of Agriculture and the university, announced Harold Kerr, Morrow County Agent.

Pesticides and their effect on the environment, recommendations for their use in Oregon and applicator regulation will be covered at the morning session of the opening day.

Most of the rest of the speakers for the three-day session will deal with special problems applicators face in conducting their business; information on pesticides and their chemistry; and the application of pesticides for weed and insect control.

Two of the speakers at the short course will look at problems resulting from the use of pesticides.

Darl (cq) A. Mount, consultant on pesticides, State Board of Health, is to discuss "Insecticides in the Bloodstream", and Tom Harrison, pesticide application supervisor, Oregon Department of Agriculture, will talk on "Spray Injury".

Mount will emphasize the need for care in handling and using pesticides and remind of the need for watching the level of pesticides in the bloodstream. Harrison will discuss some of the misapplication of herbicides.

Money Course To Be Given

Does the month sometimes last longer than your money? Do you sometimes wonder how you are going to pay all of your bills. Do you wonder what receipts and checks to keep? Do you know how much your credit costs? If the answer to any of these questions is yes or sometimes, you will want to enroll in the new correspondence course Extension is offering called "You and Your Money." This course will be given in Umatilla and Morrow Counties starting January 26. Deadline for sign-up is December 19.

The course is designed as home study for men and women but is especially suited for couples to take the course together. There will be four lessons over a period of eight weeks, allowing two weeks for each assignment. There will be a \$1 charge to cover the cost of materials used. This will cover one person or one couple.

Topics included will be records for income tax purposes, planning insurance programs for the family, deciding what you would like to have for money earned, and how all types of available credit affect the family.

The course will provide information needed for families to help them make financial decisions. Those enrolled will not have to divulge personal financial matters. Materials provided will enable the family to apply the information to their own situation.

All interested in enrolling are invited to mail or phone their name to the county extension office in Heppner.
