INFLUENZA VACCINATION FOR 1969-70 SEASON

According to the U. S. Public Health Service Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices reports are that it is unlikely that there will be more than sporadic cases of influenza due to A2 strain in the 1969-70 season. Type B influenza may appear in areas where it did not occur in 1968-69. Vaccination should be considered only for persons of any age with certain chronic debilitating conditions: 1. Rheumatic Heart Disease, especially Mitral Stenosis; 2. such cardiovascular disorders as Arteriosclerosis Heart Disease and hypertension, particularly with evidence of cardiac insufficiency; 3. Chronic Bronchopulmonary disease, such as Asthma, Chronic Bronchitis, Cystic Fibrosis, Bronchiectasis, Pulmonary Fibrosis and Emphysema.

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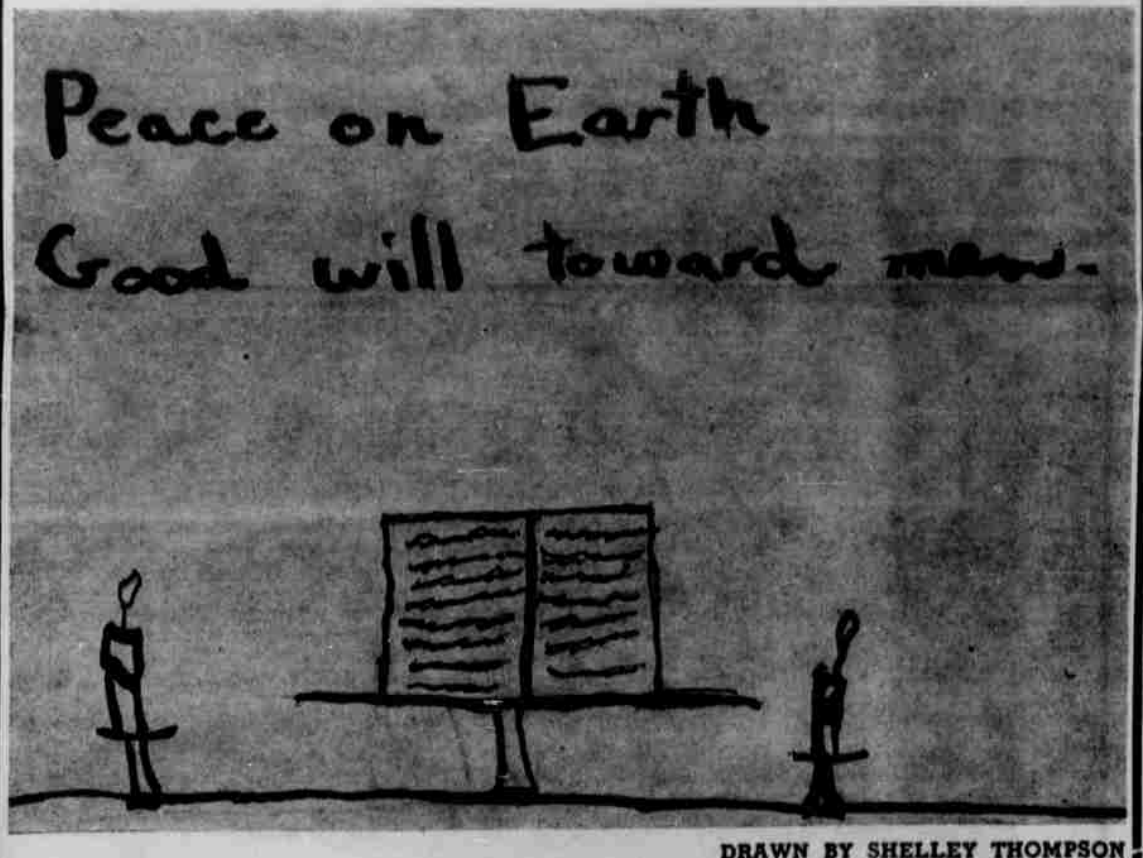
