Blue Mountain Community College's JV's were too much for the Heppner Mustangs last Saturday night (Jan. 3) in Pendleton in the first meeting of the pair. The college boys won by 10 points 72 to 62.

The Mustangs shot right with the Mountaineers in the free throw end of the game, each club sinking 66%. Where the Mustangs fell short was on field goals. The Mountaineers sank 30 to the Mustangs' 18.

La Verne Van Marter and John McCabe were the sharpshooters for the Mustangs. Van Marter poured in 16 points while McCabe dumped in 13.

The first half was the Horsemen's downfall. They were outscored by nine points in the first quarter and again in the second. At the end of the first half the score stood 41-23.

After the halftime pep talk the Mustangs were able to find the hoop a little better. In the third quarter alone they scored 20 points, which was only three points short of their first half accumulation.

In the fourth panel the Mustangs chalked up another 19 tallies, but despite a hot second half they were still 10 points short of the Mountaineers when the horn sounded.

Frank Halvorsen, a 1969 graduate of Ione High, tallied 18 points to lead Blue Devil Mountain scoring.
