Sign-up Announced For Farm Programs

Sign-up period for the 1970 Wheat and Feed Grain voluntary farm programs will begin Feb. 2 and continue through March 20, according to David McLeod, Executive Director of the County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Office.

Eligible producers may sign up at the County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Office, Heppner, during office hours throughout this period.

Notice of feed grain base acres, projected yields, and payment rates will soon be mailed to farmers. Program explanation leaflets will be included.

Wheat allotment notices and program explanations were sent in the fall of 1969 to be eligible producers following the announcement of 1970 program provisions for that crop.

Participants who comply with program provisions are eligible for price support loans and payments on their feed grain and wheat crops. Also, feed grain and wheat producers may receive payments for diverting additional acres from production of these crops.

In Morrow County 258 farms with 62,238 base acres of corn and barley are eligible for participation in the feed grain program. There are 284 farms with wheat allotment acres totaling 94,651.7.

Last year about 95 percent of the feed grain farms were signed up in the ASC farm program and about 99 percent of the wheat farms in the county.
