

Mustangs Drop Two In Weekend Play

Playing probably the poorest offensive games of the season, Bob Clough's Heppner ball club dropped two encounters last weekend. In Friday night's clash the Blue and Gold fell hard to the sharp-shooting Eagles from The Dalles, 61-50, in league play.

The Mustang cagers traveled to Walla Walla Saturday night and were defeated by the DeSales High Irish, 61-43.

In the Wahntonka contest, Heppner's second league outing, the Mustangs were stymied by a cold second quarter in which they were able to net only three fielders and a couple of free tosses. Meanwhile the visitors capitalized on the Heppner cold spell as behind Bob Tenold's hot hand they managed to put through 18 counters.

From there on out the two ball clubs played basket for basket, with the group from Chenoweth managing to outscore the Mustangs by a meager point in the second half.

Ironically, the host club put up more shots, 57 to the victor's 45. Unable to hit like the Eagles could, the Mustang percentage was only 35%. The Eagles shot 49% of their field goal attempts, many from outside. On the boards the Mustangs outrebounded their foes 35 to 29, with Pat Kilkenny and Lee Huson grabbing 11 and 8 respectively. Heppner lost the services of stand-out guard John McCabe in the third quarter when he sustained an ankle injury. He still copped point honors, scoring 14 in little more than a half. LaVerne Van Marter and Lee Huson netted 12 and 11.

Heppner routed DeSales on the Heppner floor by 27 points, but failed to capture the lead even once in the teams' second meeting. Without the services of McCabe, the Mustangs just didn't have any offense to speak of in the whole contest. They had four cold quarters and



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were unable to hit the basket from anywhere.

At the end of the game LaVerne Van Marter led the Mustangs with 13 points.

Heppner again out-rebounded the opposition, 43-32. Pat Kilkenny grabbed 12 caroms to lead the loser's cause.

Heppner's record now stands at 10 wins to 5 defeats, and their league record is one win, one loss.
