### Takeover of Reseal Grain Loan

Some reseal grain loans must be settled by redemption or delivery or forfeiture. Maturity dates of loans being called differ by crop year and are not the same as current loan maturity dates. All 1964-1965-1966 farm stored wheat loans are being called. The 1967 warehouse extended loans are being called. All other wheat and barley loans in Morrow County are eligible for reseal or extended reseal. Producers must make application in ASCS office prior to maturity date for particular loan.

The maturity date for 1964 and 1965 wheat loans is March 31, 1970. These loans must be settled shortly after this date by the desired option.

The maturity date for 1966 wheat loans is May 31, 1970, and must be settled shortly after that date.

The 1967 warehouse loans, extended reseal, must be settled following May 31 maturity date.

The 1964 crop hard wheat is subject to premiums and discounts for protein content and

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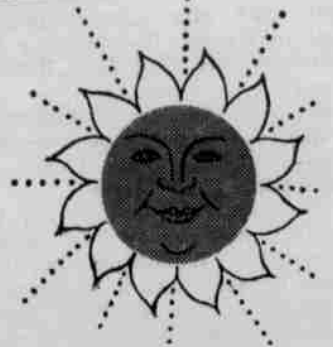

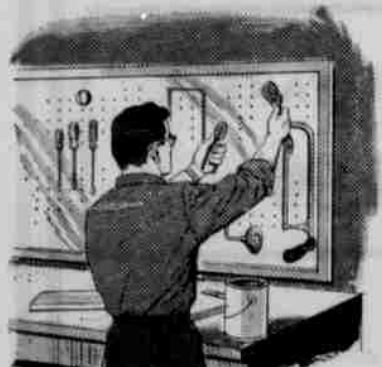
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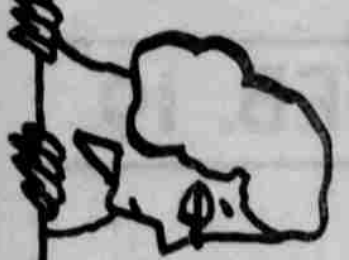
