IONE—The American Legion potluck Birthday dinner was held at the hall March 21. Dr. and Mrs. Hummel showed pictures and told of their recent trip to the Orient. Errett said he was amazed at three things: first, the large population in such small areas. Farms are less than one acre plots. Second, there is only rich and poor. There is no middle class. Third, the women do the work and the men do the bossing. He showed many pictures of the beautiful temples and grounds of the rich, comparing them to the homes and life of the poorer class. Tourists drink bottled water or beer over there. The people bathe, wash their clothes, dishes, horses, etc. and all refuse is dumped into the streams and ocean. The people themselves bathe every day and have clean clothes, but their living conditions are deplorable. They use only the crudest implements in everything they do, as modern machines would put too many people out of work.

Errett and Madeline Hummel live at 1945 S. W. Warwick, Portland. Errett is a professor at Portland State College and Madeline works as a secretary in the office of the Beaverton School District. He came to Ione in 1923-24 and attended school here, as his mother, Mrs. Blanche Hummel was teaching here in the grade school at that time. (Mrs. Hummel passed away 2 years ago.) Errett also attended school in Hardman and Boardman.

Shortly after he and Madeline were married he came back to Ione as principal from 1937 to 1942. Errett Jr., was born in Ione. He is married, has 3 children, and lives in Portland. He has his degree in medicine, and is now doing his residency at the Oregon Medical School to specialize in neuro-surgery.

Errett enlisted in the Navy and served as an officer during World War II. After his return their daughter Susan was born at Burns, Susan, now Mrs. John Kilby has one child, and lives at Beaverton. She works as a secretary in one of the Beaverton schools, and her husband works in a nursery.
