Houghton Elementary in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1970-1971 over the amount limited by section 11, Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:

- Increases in salary for all personnel
- Increases in retirement and social security
- Increases in property insurance

The amount of tax, in excess of the constitutional limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$671,245, which expressed as a rate of levy, is estimated at \$18.60 per thousand dollars of true cash value of taxable property within the district. Dated this 16th day of March, 1970.
