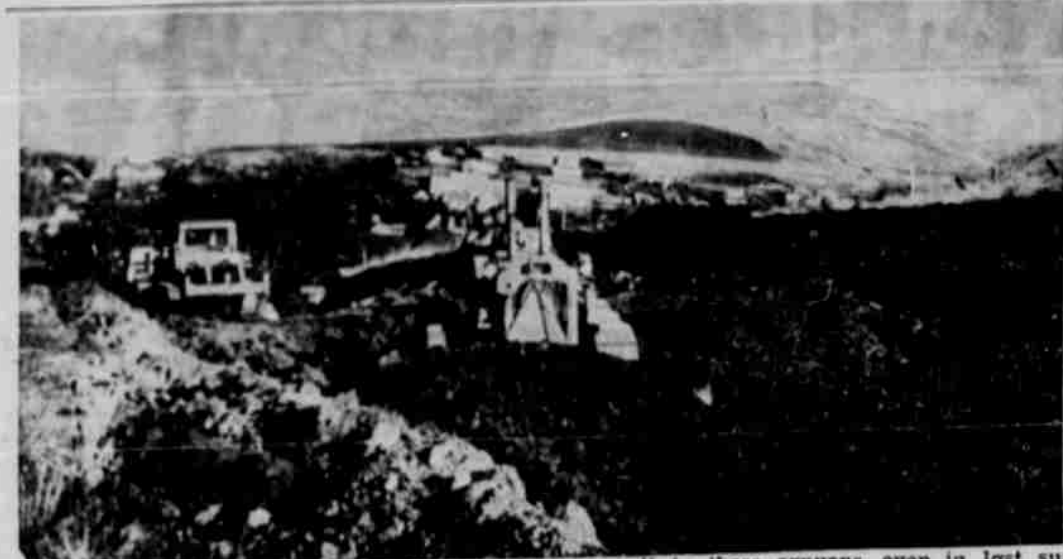

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New Cake and Frosting Recipe

For The

1970 CAKE BAKING CONTEST

OREGON WHEAT GROWERS LEAGUE

Official Cake Recipe — 1970

MRS. DON PETERSON, Morrow County Chairman

This is a standard recipe that must be used by All Contestants

ORANGE-LEMON PARTY CAKE (9 inch 3 layer cake)

2-1/4 cups sifted cake flour	3/4 cup freshly squeezed orange juice
1-1/2 cups sugar	2 tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon juice
3 teaspoons baking powder	1 cup egg whites
1 teaspoon salt	1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1/2 cup salad oil	
4 egg yolks, unbeaten	
2 tablespoons freshly grated orange peel	

Sift together flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in large bowl. Make a well in center; add oil, egg yolks, orange peel, orange and lemon juices. Beat with a spoon until smooth. In large mixer bowl, beat egg whites until frothy; add cream of tartar and continue beating until whites hold very stiff peaks. Gently pour batter over beaten whites; carefully fold with rubber spatula until blended. Pour into three 9 inch layer cake pans that have been lined on the bottom with greased waxed paper. Bake at 350 degrees F. for 30 to 35 minutes. Let cool in pans for 10 minutes before turning out onto wire racks to cool completely.

ORANGE-LEMON FILLING (2 cups)

1 cup sugar	2 eggs, beaten
1/4 cup flour	2 tablespoons, freshly squeezed lemon juice
1 cup freshly squeezed orange juice	1/4 cup butter
1 tablespoon freshly grated orange peel	

In saucepan, thoroughly combine sugar and flour; gradually stir in orange peel and juice until smooth. Blend in beaten eggs and lemon juice; add butter. Bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring constantly; gently boil 2 to 3 minutes. Cool thoroughly. Reserve 1/2 cup for top of cake; spread remaining filling between layers.

FROSTING

1/2 cup granulated sugar	1 tablespoon freshly grated orange peel
2 egg whites	1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup shortening	1/8 teaspoon salt
1 cup unsifted powdered sugar	1/2 cup reserved orange-lemon filling

Combine granulated sugar and egg whites in top of double boiler; place over simmering water and heat to 150 degrees F. (about 3 min.). Stir frequently to prevent egg whites from cooking. Pour into small mixer bowl and beat at high speed until a stiff meringue forms; set aside. In large mixer bowl, cream shortening and powdered sugar until light and fluffy. Add orange peel, vanilla and salt; beat until well combined. Add 1/2 cup of the meringue; beat 5 minutes at medium speed. Add remaining meringue, beating until fluffy. Spread frosting over sides of cake and around outside edge of top layer forming about a 2 inch border. Spread reserved 1/2 cup filling in center of cake.
