Plan Shows Need for Extra Public Fallout Shelters Many Areas

The Morrow County shelter plan shows a shortage of near-by public fallout shelter protection available to people living in most of the rural and city areas south of Boardman and Irrigon. Paul Jones, Morrow County judge, said today.

"Because of daily and seasonal population shifts, at least 8,700 more local public shelter spaces are now needed", Judge Jones said.

He says the answer lies in the inclusion of shelter in the design and construction of new buildings at little or no increase in cost. He noted that the Department of Defense has sponsored a fallout shelter development program that trains architects and engineers on methods of designing fallout shelter in a new structure. The techniques used have no adverse effect on the beauty of primary functions of the structures, whether they are schools, commercial or industrial buildings.

"The time to include this fallout protection in buildings is during the design stage. Then it is possible to add fallout protection easily and cheaply", Judge Jones said.

The Judge noted that new school buildings are prime candidates for fallout protection in their designs because they are located where most of the people live and can afford protection for children during school hours. They may also be used as public shelters by near-by residents. Unfortunately, however, only two of the present Morrow County schools are so constructed as to offer this protection.

"We can overcome this lack of fallout protection if we will only take advantage of the technical advice available and spend the very few dollars needed to do the job," he said.

Official information giving citizens full details on Morrow County's community shelter plan and advising them where to go and what to do in an attack situation will be distributed beginning Monday, May 4.
