Plans are underway for the May 16-17 Spray rodeo. The Flying 5 Rodeo Stock Contractors have been hired. The events will be Bareback Riding, Calf Roping, Saddle Bronc Riding, Bull Dogging, Team Roping, Bull Riding, and Barrel Racing.

The rodeo is approved by the Northwest Rodeo Association and cowboys from all over the Northwest are expected to enter as this weekend is the official opening of the NRA rodeos which consist of most rodeos throughout Oregon and Washington during the season.

The Western Gentlemen have been hired for the Queen's Ball Friday night and the big rodeo dance Saturday night.
