Mrs. Agnew's recipe for Maryland Crab Imperial and Lady Bird's recipe for Lima Bean and Mushroom Casserole. For teasers they have enclosed several recipes, one was Mrs.

Agnew's recipe for:

Avgalemono Soup or Chicken Rice Soup.

1 chicken, stewing, enough water to cover, salt, pepper, whole onion (optional) celery leaves (optional) 3 eggs, juice of 1 or 2 lemons, 1 cup rice.

Boil chicken with onion and celery leaves until tender. Remove chicken and let it cool. Strain the broth, return it to the heat and when it begins to boil, add the rice, salt and pepper. When the rice is cooked, lower the heat to simmer. Beat the eggs until frothy, then add the lemon juice a little at a time,

beating well. Remove a little broth and add to the egg lemon mixture, beating continuously. Remove the broth from the heat, and add the egg lemon mixture to the rest of the broth. Be sure to vigorously stir the egg lemon mixture while you are working with it, so that the eggs will not curdle. Let stand a few minutes before serving. Serves 6 to 8.
