Irrigon Budget Adopted

IRRIGON—The budget for fiscal year 1970-71 for the City of Irrigon, was adopted at a hearing at the regular Council meeting in May. Total budget amount, including reserve funds, is \$26,118. Of this amount \$7,561 is in the general fund, \$6,043 in the State Street fund and \$8,142 in the Water Department. Taxes to be levied are within the 6% limitation and amount to \$1,580. The balance of budget resources will be derived from local revenues and State funds allocated from various sources.
