Father Dan Thompson is new rector of All Saints' Episcopal Church, Heppner. He, his wife, Francie, and their son, Paul were welcomed by the congregation of the church at services and at a potluck dinner following on Sunday, June 14. They will live in the recently purchased parsonage on Baltimore Street.

The Thompsons came here from Missoula, Mont., where he was associate rector of Holy Spirit Parish. They are not newcomers to Eastern Oregon, however; both were born and reared in the Klamath Falls area.

Father Thompson received a degree in education from Southern Oregon College and taught in elementary schools of Klamath County for six years before attending Episcopal Theological School in Cambridge, Mass. He was vicar of St. Michael's, Alturas and St. James, Milton-Freewater before going to Missoula.

Although his formal institution of rector of All Saints', Heppner, will not be until Aug. 9, Father Thompson is now at work and has assumed his various responsibilities in the district. In addition to being rector here, he will be Dean of Beginners' Camp at Ascension Summer School in Cove, Chairman of the Christian Education Department of the Missionary District of Eastern Oregon and Vicar of St. Michael's in Condon.

Dan likes Eastern Oregon which he has long appreciated for its recreational opportunities. He and his wife hope to have time for their hobbies of hunting, fishing, horses, Indian artifacts and local history.

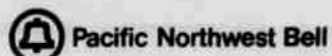
