

Flower Pointers For the Fair Given

Pointers for exhibiting flowers at the Fair were reviewed and discussed at the meeting of the Heppner Garden Club Monday evening. The group met at the home of Mrs. Alice McCabe.

Number one rule is: Read the Premium Book. This gives the rules and regulations for horticulture division and the floral arrangements, page 35. Note Rule 5—Horticulture specimen must be grown by the exhibitor and should be LABELED with the correct name whenever possible. This is considered an educational label so that anyone liking the specimen can write down the name so it can be asked for correctly at the nursery.

Mrs. Bill Rawlins gave the procedure for preparing the flowers. They should be cut with a sharp knife the day before the show. It should be cut at a slant to give maximum water intake. They should be cut early in the morning or late evening. The flowers should be placed in deep water over night, if possible and at least for several hours. The foliage that will be below the water line in the arrangement or container for the horticultural specimen may be removed. Mrs. Rawlins explained that the water would be supplied to the foliage before the blossom.

Care should be exercised to cut the blooms in the right stage, not too far open and not too close to bud stage. Some buds like glads will continue to open while other buds will wilt and drop.

Mrs. Rawlins showed a method of transporting flowers. Take a large flatish box of heavy cardboard with a telescoped lid and cut a hole in the lid the size of the containers. When the container is set in this hole, it is held upright and apart from other containers.

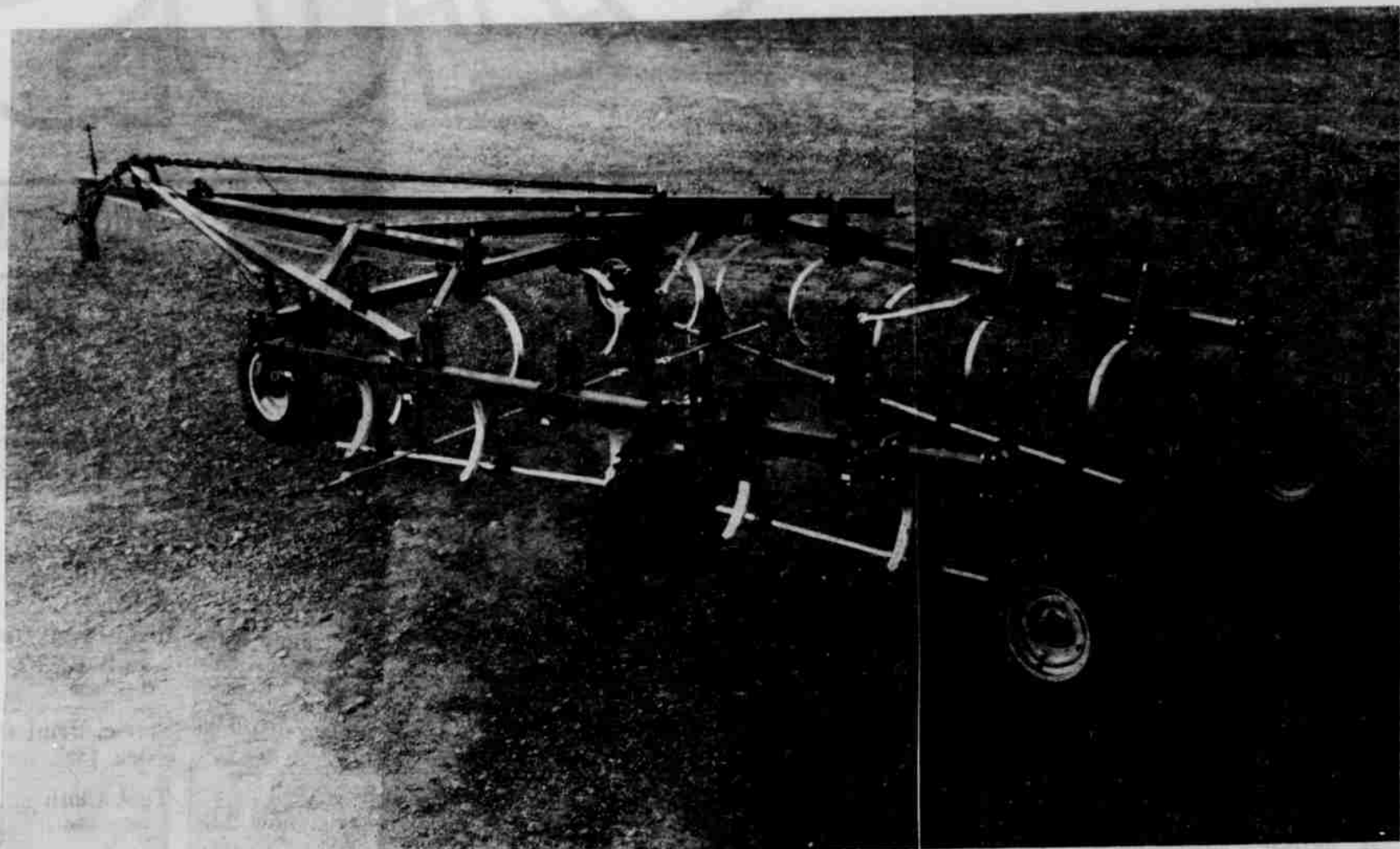
